

























The bingo cards on the following pages have categories with errors frequently found in social media posts. If you are not comfortable with having your students look for their own examples from social media due to the possibility of finding inappropriate content, you could just collect examples yourself, and then compile them in a list for students to work from. It's also not necessary to limit the errors to those found in social media posts. They could include errors whenever or wherever they find them.

If you wish to tweak the types of errors for students to look for, see the link on the previous page for an editable template.

Students may need explanations for some of the categories, so it's a good idea to review them before assigning the bingo card. Most of the categories are probably pretty clear for you, but here are explanations for a few that may not be readily obvious:

- wrong part of speech: The wrong word form was used, such as writing an adjective where an adverb is needed. (Example: I did good on my test.)
- **pronoun disagreement:** Pronoun does not agree with its antecedent. (Example: Most of the students brought **his** own lunch.)

You might also wish to include pronoun referent ambiguity for this category. (Example: The man brought his son to a baseball game, and **he** was so happy.)

- wrong pronoun form: An object pronoun was used instead of a subject pronoun, or vice versa. (Example: My friend and me went to a concert.)
- wrong verb form: This could be a verb tense or usage error, such as not using the past participle with a perfect tense. (Example: I have already ate my lunch.)
